Jack and his family relocate to another state and apply for new Health and Human Services programs without notifying agencies in the previous state.



Cindy's parents live in different states. Both receive assistance for her in their respective states.



Jane's identity has been stolen and used to apply for benefits elsewhere without her knowledge.

Each of these situations sets up the potential for duplicate enrollment in public benefit programs. In many cases, it's unintentional; more likely a simple misunderstanding or oversight by the enrollee. Other times, dual participation may be a deliberate attempt to "double dip" and profit. Either way, the programs — and taxpayers who fund them — pay a hefty price.

The big picture...

- Dual participation leads to an estimated \$700M worth of improper payments annually in Medicaid, CHIP and SNAP programs alone.
- This amounts to billions of dollars a year when aggregated across all public assistance programs.

- Lack of visibility is a major issue for agencies. States typically can't view Participation rolls in other states or programs.

AmplifyID™ Program Participation Analyzer grew out of the success of the National Accuracy Clearinghouse (NAC), a solution implemented to address dual participation in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance program (SNAP). An evaluation of NAC published in October 2015* documented several elements of NAC's performance, outcomes and costs found the following:

- Prior to implementation, 10,076 instances of duplicate enrollment across the five states were identified. One year later, duplicate enrollment in these five states had been reduced by almost 50% (5,464 instances identified).
- In the first year, using NAC produced an estimated annualized savings of \$5,597,076 (less the \$669,331 spent on one-time startup costs).
- Nationalizing NAC has been estimated to result in \$114,072,753 in annual savings. Costs of setting up and utilizing NAC for the first year came to about \$1,652,287 for all five participating states. USDA-FNS provides federal matching funds for states' program administration costs, including costs of NAC participation.

Congress has since mandated the use of NAC by all state SNAP agencies. AmplifyID™ Program Participation Analyzer leverages similar technology, best practices and subject matter expertise used in the NAC to provide the same type of solution for all other government programs.


